

The thriller, 'Wait Until Dark' is a play by Frederick Knott, first performed on Broadway in 1966 and often revived since then. A film version was released in 1967 starring Audrey Hepburn. The suspense-filled drama will hit the stage at Magnolia Hall with the tense plot that twists and turns and ultimately shocks audiences. Directed by William McDougall & Mary-Alice Mangan and Produced by Dominick Wasliewski.

Susy, with the help of Gloria (Elliott Lentz) , a young girl, struggles to survive a vicious attack by these criminals.
