


Winneker's 'Border Line'

Border Line is Allan Winneker's fourth work of fiction. He became interested in the subject after learning of the many dangers faced by the U.S. Border Patrol.

Winneker, a native of Philadelphia, enjoyed a 38-year career in marketing management before retiring to begin writing novels and enjoying life with his wife Betty on Callawassie Island.
