The 2015 Lowcountry Arts and Literary Festival will take place on Saturday, October 24 from 10 am ♦ 6 pm on the grounds of the historic Frampton Plantation, 1 Lowcountry Lane, in Yemassee, SC.

♦♦♦♦♦♦♦♦♦♦ Along with the writers and artists, the Sons of Confederate Veterans Charles Jones Colcock Camp #2100 will be on hand to assist the Festival staff behind the scenes. The camp will exhibit a living history among the oaks, on this historic site where the Battle of Pocotaligo was fought in 1862. They will also offer a concession stand to sell food and beverages.
