Since 2000, Art League of Hilton Head has awarded an annual scholarship in the amount of \$2000 to a graduating high school senior who is studying or living on Hilton Head Island and attending a local high school. This year the applicants who were interviewed were of such high caliber that Art League awarded two scholarships of \$1,250 each.
