Stayin' Alive: August 7 – 9

Staying Alive is the world's number one tribute band to the Bee Gees hits the stage. This highly renowned group has thrived on the international music scene longer than any group in pop history, attesting to both their talent and adaptability. Because of their distinct and blended harmonies, the brothers Barry, Robin and Maurice Gibb have offered an impossible challenge to those who would pay them homage... until now!

Stayin' Alive, with the vocal talents of Tony Mattina, Todd Sharman, and George Manz, creates a realistic experience of hearing and watching the brothers' Gibb live in concert. This vocal trio, backed by studio musicians, completely capture the special sound of The Bee Gees.

In the 60's, some of the most iconic names in the history of popular music were discovered in the Motor City of Detroit, better known as Motown. Masters of Motown is a celebration of these artists, their dynamic music and their timeless sound. The non-stop show features stylishly costumed, fully choreographed performances of the 10-member cast, including three female vocalists, three male vocalists, guitar, bass, drums and keys, who have come together to reproduce the style, sound and ultimate feel that was quintessentially Motown. Throughout the course of the show, these performers transform into Stevie Wonder, The Four Tops, Diane Ross and the Supremes, The Pointer Sisters, The Jackson Five and so many more.
