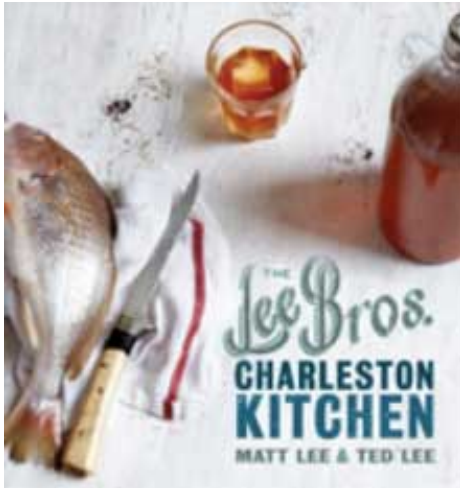


When Is A Cookbook More Than A Cookbook?

When gourmand Dorothea Benton Frank read the manuscript, she said, "This beautiful, charming, witty, nostalgic edition is filled with delicious memories. Growing up in the heart of the historic downtown, in a warbler-yellow house on Charleston's fabled "Rainbow Row," brothers Matt and Ted knew how to cast for shrimp before they were in middle school, and could catch and pick crabs soon after. They learned to recognize the fruit trees that grew around town and knew to watch for the day in late March when the loquats on the tree on Chalmers Street ripened. Matt and Ted's new cookbook brings the vibrant food culture of this great Southern city to life, introducing readers to the people, past and present, who have left their mark on the food culture of the Holy City.

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
