The festival is a celebration of literature, including the launch of the fourth volume in the *Short Story America*

anthology series of short stories (the books from SSA are chock full of contemporary short stories by today's authors). JODI PALONI: Beyond Setting the Scene: The Role of Place in the Short Story

Description: An unforgettable short story lingers when a character imprints your mind or a certain scene blows your existing notions of humanity out of the water. But what about the story remembered because the writer has rendered a sense of place so compelling it connects with the reader's personal aesthetic? We want to relive the sensibility of the landscape again and again. And what about the story where place itself serves as character? In this workshop, participants will discuss excerpts lifted from some of our most beloved short story writers in an inter-active consideration of how an author's use of place sets thematic tone, shows character interiority (outer landscape/inner landscape), and binds the narrative arc. Time will be set aside for generative work to test out new ideas of looking at the role of place in our own short fiction.
