For more than a century the rambling wood building on the corner of West and Bay Streets stood as the center of commerce in downtown Beaufort.

Built in 1883, the Lipsitz name first appeared on the building 1902. Three generations of Lipsitz worked in the department store. Some family members lived in the apartments on the second floor. When the store finally closed its doors for the last time in 2010 it had weathered fire, flood, hurricanes, freak snowstorms, the advent of electricity, indoor plumbing and the telephone.
