Release Your Inner Cowboy or Just Enjoy the Wild West: For a rip-roaring good time that your kids will rave about for years to come, consider a Dude Ranch. The entire family can get outdoors for horseback riding, fishing, hiking, and swimming in ponds and streams, and then

gather nightly around the campfire for stories and S'mores. River raft beneath the Grand Tetons, witness the eruption of Old Faithful Geyser in Yellowstone and be on the lookout for herds of bison & elk -- the kids will definitely have fodder for their "what I did on my summer vacation" paper when summer's over.

So Long Harry: This summer, the last Harry Potter movie will premier, ending what has been an epic nine-year run of movies from the much-loved J.K. Rowlings series. Make it an extra special farewell with a visit to *Universal Studio Orlando's The Wizarding World of Harry Potter*

Ships As Destinations: While favorite family destinations include Alaska, Europe and Hawaii, some ships have become destinations in themselves, such as those from Disney and Royal Caribbean. Perfect for multi-generational travel, there's something for every age, both onboard and on shore, to guarantee precious family memories.
